- 4) A Resolution pursuant to §11-40-1 et. and §38-2-9 Code of Alabama 1975 authorizing the Mayor to execute and deliver an agreement with Daniel Payne Legacy Village Foundation (DPVLF), under which DPVLF, will expand their Meal Subscription Service program. The Meal Subscription Service project aims to significantly expand DPVLF's current food service programming to allow a Birmingham-based household to subscribe and receive 32 servings/meals per month by paying a subscription fee. The City of Birmingham will contribute towards the 1 year of service for 100 families and the distribution of 38,400 meals. The City will provide funding received under the to the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), for a term of one year in an amount not to exceed \$230,000.

Overview of City Finances & Proposed Budget Amendments for FY2025 Diana Bolden presented information relative to the 2025 Amended Budget (via slide presentation): **Proposed:**

- Cost of living adjustment of 3% for all employees
- 5% merit increase to all eligible employees
- Longevity pay to all eligible employees
- The weed abatement from 2024 has increased by \$750,000.00
- Demolition from 2024 has increased by of \$1,500,000.00
- Sidewalks from 2024 has increased by \$800,000.00
- Rolling stock and deferred maintenance from will remain the same.

2025 Revenue Components:

Total of \$582 million vs. \$557 million for 2024.

The Birmingham Fund balance as of 10/31/2024 is \$121 million.

The City's revenues are up by 5%.

There is no increase in healthcare or pension costs to the employee.
