As part of the American Rescue Plan Act, my office received \$3 million to put back into communities across District 9. Here's how some of that money has been put to work so far:







- **PUBLIC SAFETY INITIATIVES: \$380,000**
- CRITICAL REPAIR/FACADE **IMPROVEMENTS: \$1.12 MILLION** HEALTHY HOUSING INITIATIVE, NHSB (\$300K), HOMEOWNER FACADE IMPROVEMENTS, METRO CHANGERS (\$200K), PROTECTING GOOD (\$200K), HOUSEPROUD (\$420K)
- **WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT: \$70,000** BIRMINGHAM URBAN LEAGUE (\$20K), SALVATION ARMY(\$50K)
- **★** TRAILS AND PARKS: \$290,000 ENSLEY RECREATION CENTER (\$30K), MCALPINE PARK (\$30K), NORTH BIRMINGHAM PARK (\$40K), WYLAM PARK (\$60K), ONE PRATT PARK LANDSCAPE (\$100K), DOLOMITE REC CENTER IMPROVEMENTS (\$30K)
- **PENNY FOUNDATION: \$27,500** FUTURE FORWARD GRANTS AWARDED TO D9 MINORITY-**OWNED BUSINESSES**
- **BIRMINGHAM TOOL BANK: \$50,000** SERVING COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS BY PROVIDING TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT AS RENTALS
- **BLACK WOMEN'S MENTAL HEALTH INSTITUTE: \$100,000**
